LIMITED WINTER PARKING AND SNOW AND ICE REMOVAL FROM SIDEWALKS

Pursuant to Article IV Parking, § 179-6 Limited Winter Parking, of the Town Code,

- A. No person being the owner, operator or person in control of any motor vehicle shall, between the hours of 11:00 P.M. and 6:00 A.M. of the following day, during the period from December 1 of each year to March 31 of the following year, park or permit his motor vehicle to be parked on any public street, not including State highways, in the Town of Barrington.
- B. Parking during snowstorms. No person being the owner, operator or person in control of any motor vehicle shall park or permit his motor vehicle to be parked on any public street, not including state highways, in the Town of Barrington during any snowstorm after a snowfall of one inch has occurred and for a period of 12 hours after a snowfall of at least one inch has occurred.
- C. Removal of vehicles; payment of charges. The Police Chief and the Director of Public Works are each empowered and may summarily cause to be removed from the streets of the Town any motor vehicle parked in violation of this section when the presence of such a motor vehicle interferes with the orderly removal of snow or ice from the streets. Before any motor vehicle which has been removed pursuant to this section shall be released to the owner thereof, the owner shall pay all garage charges according to the Public Utilities Commission's Rules and Regulations.

Pursuant to Article II Snow and Ice Removal, §164-5 Sidewalks; Snow and Ice Removal, of the Town Code,


a. *Generally.* The owner, occupant or any person having the care of any building or lot of land bordering on any street, highway, square or public place within the town where there is a sidewalk shall, by noon the day following any snowfall, cause such snow and/or ice to be removed. This section shall also apply to the falling of snow and/or ice from any building.

b. *Enforcement.* For every hour after noon the following day that the snow and/or ice shall remain on a sidewalk, such owner, occupant or any person having the duty to care for the property shall pay a fine of not less than \$1.00 nor more than \$10.00 per hour, except that a warning may be issued for a first offense. The Police Department shall be charged with the duty of enforcement.

c. *Hardship.* Individuals who are physically incapable of removing the snow and/or ice or who lack financial means to pay for such removal may apply to the Director of the Department of Pubic Works for a hardship waiver from this ordinance.
